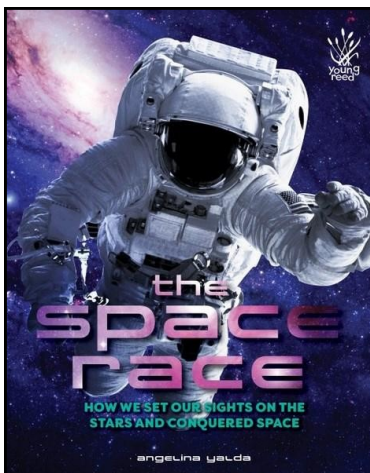
Amazing Structures of the World

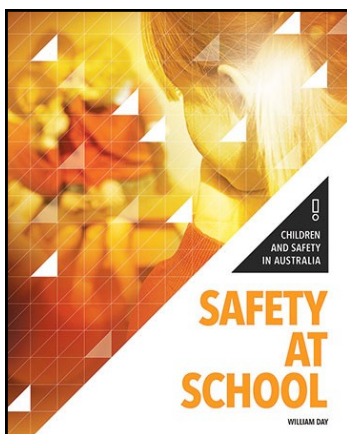
This month as part of your Non Fiction selection you will find four titles in the new series ***Children and Safety in Australia***. We are sure that these will be a great addition to your school library resources.

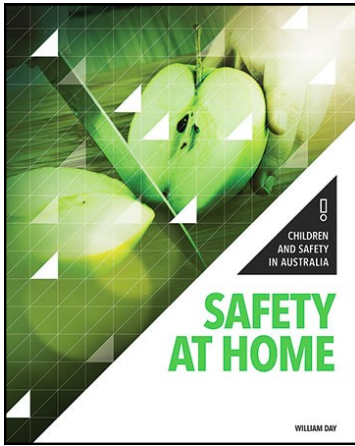


Children and Safety in Australia: Safety Away From Home

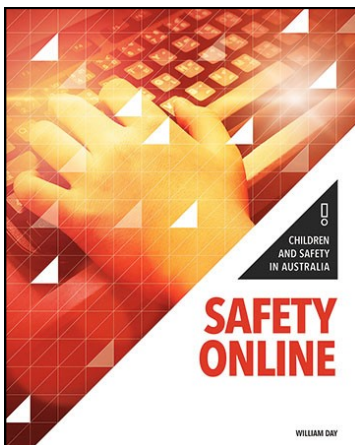
