

Discussion Questions:

- Where did Funky Chicken live? Find out all you can about this town, including locating it on a map of Australia.
- Can you recall which animals came to visit Funky Chicken?
- As a class, make a list of the animals and then group them into their classification, ie: marsupial etc..
- What sort of conditions did the animal friends encounter on their way to save Old Croc?
- Listen to the narrated story that is supplied with the book. Do the voices of the animals sound like you thought they might? Why or why not?
- What characteristics did Funky Chicken show in agreeing to go and help Old Croc? What characteristics did the other animals show in their endeavours?
- The animals all worked together as a team. When else might team work come in handy to fix a problem?
- Think of a time when you did something that you needed to say sorry to a friend for. Write a rhyming letter to that person, like the one that Old Croc wrote to Funky Chicken.
- Funky Chicken and Old Croc ended up as friends, even though their friendship was an unlikely one. What would be some other unlikely animal friendships?
- Old Croc was trapped by a croc-hunter. As a class, research the legality and history of crocodile hunting and why they would be hunted.
- Using the same map from above, highlight all the areas where you would find crocodiles in Australia.
- Make your own Funky Chicken, making sure to use a variety of coloured feathers, or make a replica of Old Croc.
