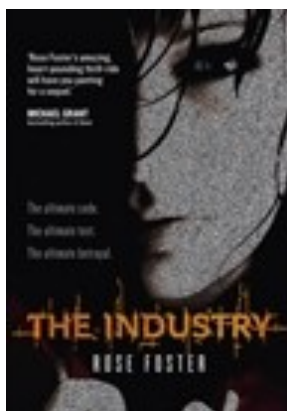

## Love-Shy

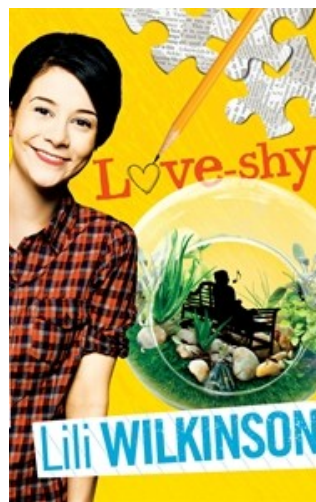

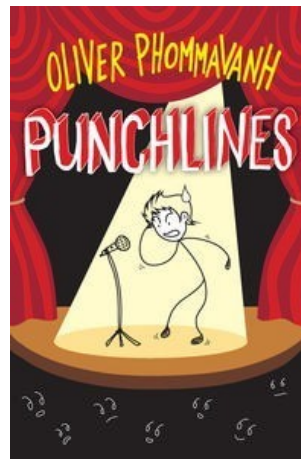
