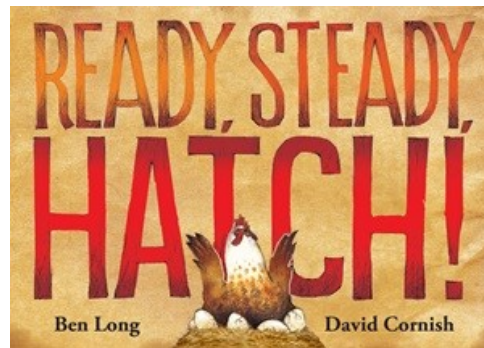
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Round and bright, and creamy white, amid the pumpkin patch, a clutch of eggs was sprouting legs. READY, STEADY, HATCH!

Themes:

- Chickens
- Curiosity

Discussion Questions:

- How many chickens were there at the start of the story, when the eggs all hatched?
- How and why did the last chicken get separated from the rest of them?
- 'They marched in line through lead and vine, a dashing little troop, and flapped along in jolly song, searching for their coop.' Do you know what a 'coop' is?
- As a class, research what is unique about a chicken coop and what you would need to make one.
- What activities did the other chickens do on their travels when they were trying to find the lost one?
- Do you think they had fun while they were searching for her?
- How would you describe the attitude of the other chickens to the lost one?
- How and why do you think the lost chicken found herself in the cherry? Why do you think the other chickens didn't find the cherry as they were marching along?
- Describe how you think the lost chicken was feeling.
- The family celebrated at the end of the story with scones and cherry jam. Make a list of some of the other things that you can make with cherries.

Activities:

- Arrange to have a 'chicken hatching' program for your class or school, to give the children a true sense of *Ready, Steady, Hatch!* There are a number of different programs available in the different states, and this can lead to many other activities and projects that the children can undertake.
- All the chickens had unique and distinctive colours and patterns. Create a pastel drawing of your favourite one.
- Using the list that you made earlier, have a class 'cherry' party.
